

Working with flowers is a beautiful form of art that has calming, meditative and healthful effects for those who design with natural materials. Floral designs bring nature, happiness, serenity and beauty into our living spaces. Hence, we find Peace in Nature, or Pax in Natura in Latin. Yet, modern floral

design mechanics can be harmful to ourselves and the environment in which we live.

My historical research into ancient floral design has helped me rediscover ways to create sustainable designs, using mechanics based on ancient techniques that are free from floral foam, glues, and plastics. I try to incorporate locally grown, seasonal flowers, and foraged greenery into my designs as much as possible, with the intention of lowering the carbon footprint caused by imported flowers. Aside from the environmental and health benefits of these practices, they have another advantage, reducing the cost of floral creations.

My signature designs are recreations of Greco-Roman floral crowns, wreaths, and leis. I also use ancient images of flowers and gardens as inspiration for my more conventional bouquets and centerpieces. In these, I incorporate historical elements: greenery, flowers and/or design shapes popular in different places and eras.

To share my designs, I offer a range of workshops for in-person gatherings teaching basic "ancient" design mechanics that promote sustainable floral skills. My classes are friendly and fun as well as calming and meditative. I encourage participants to see the beauty and peace in nature while working with natural materials.

GRECO-ROMAN CROWN

REDUCE, REUSE, RECYCLE

In this workshop, participants are encouraged to bring their own container found in their homes, thrift shops, and offices to help reduce waste through creative reuse of materials. These designs will tend to be diminutive, sweet and rustic in appearance, but can be designed to accentuate the style of container.

WHERE AND HOW WE WORK

I travel to locations within the San Francisco Bay Area From San Francisco to Santa Cruz on the West Bay and from Berkeley to Gilroy on the East Bay. I travel further afield at a higher cost.

I teach up to 15 people per event. Accommodations can be made for groups over this size, but 15 or fewer participants is an ideal size.

I work closely with you to determine color schemes and types of flowers you wish to use in your designs. Due to the nature of flower markets, last minute changes might be necessary, and I will keep you informed at all stages of the process.

Payment

Half of the agreed cost is due one week after the agreement is signed.

The remaining payment is due 48 hours before the session.

Full refunds are available for any cancellations prior to 48 hours before the scheduled event. Cancellations made after this will be reimbursed, minus the cost of the flowers and greenery.

What You Get with Each Class

A two-hour session at a location of your choice. It is the customer's responsibility to ensure safety and access requirements for the location of the event.

Materials provided in the cost: containers, flowers, greenery, ribbons, and other decorative elements. These are yours to keep.

Floral scissors will be provided for use on the day, but I encourage participants to bring their own, if they have them.
